About this document

This user guide explains how to effectively and completely make use of the CB Core, CB Pro system. For more information on how to install the CB Core, CB Pro, refer to the installation manual.

About introduction

Details about the product will be explored in this chapter. It will also establish some common terminology required to follow the rest of the manual effectively.

Clarification of the term "CB Core, CB Pro" used in this document

When referring in this document to the term "CB Core, CB Pro" means that the content is applicable for following Barco products:

- · CB Core
- CB Pro

Regional variants

Depending on the purchase location, the Base Unit and accessories are regionalized.



The CB Core, CB Pro is region locked, meaning that it cannot be used outside its original region!



Depending on the CB Core, CB Pro version, some graphics may look different than the ones used in this manual. This does not have any effect on the functionality that is described.

1.1 The collaboration bar

What is a collaboration bar



The ClickShare collaboration bar is referred to as "Base Unit" throughout the manual.

The collaboration bar controls and enables the functionality of the ClickShare. It has a camera, speakers, microphones and ultrasound speaker built-in. There are two variants of the bar available:

- The CB Core, enabling an essential ClickShare experience.
- The CB Pro, enabling the complete ClickShare experience.



CB Core, CB Pro is only compatible with generation 4 Buttons! For more information, see "The conferencing Button", page 10.

Collaboration bar components




Image 1-1 Front view with privacy door attached

- Reset button




Image 1-2 Back view with cable cover attached

Removing the cable cover gives access to the connections and ports.




Image 1-3 Back view with cable cover removed

There is an additional plastic protective layer on the lens for new devices! Remove this plastic layer before use.




Image 1-4 Front view with privacy door removed





Image 1-5 CB Core without a cable cover

LED ring

There is an LED ring at the front of the Base Unit that clearly communicates what the current status of the ClickShare and its peripherals are.

See the following table to know what each color or color animation stands for:

1.2 The conferencing Button

What is a conferencing Button



The conferencing Button will be referred to as "Button" throughout the manual.

The conferencing Button is a small USB powered wireless device that simplifies sharing and using ClickShare to a single press of a button.

Generation 4 Button overview

A generation 4 Button is easily identified by its USB-C™ connector to pair with Base Unit(s) and connect with devices.




Image 1-7 Generation 4 Button

- 1 Share button
- 2 ClickShare menu button
- 3 USB-C™ connector
- 4 Strap holes

Button functionality

Pressing the buttons can have different effects. It also allows for interaction and seamless switching between multiple presenters.

See table below for more information:

Action	Function
Short press on share button	Starts sharing
Long press on share button	Takes over sharing
Press the menu button	Brings up the ClickShare app

Button LED ring

There is an LED ring around the share button. The color or animation of this ring helps signal what the Button is currently doing and what state it is.

See table below for the possible colors or animations and their meaning:

LED	Meaning
White fill	Setting up the connection
Steady white	Connected and ready to be used
Blinking white	Unable to connect ClickShare app not running
Fast white spinning	Device busy Device processing
Purple	Hostflow without sharing
Purple - red spinning	Hostflow with sharing
Steady red	Sharing
Blinking red	Error

About getting started

The fundamentals of sharing, meeting and using ClickShare will be explored in this chapter.

2.1 Preparing the hardware

About preparing the hardware

Before ClickShare can be used to its fullest, some preparations must be completed. Depending on the setup of the meeting room or previous experiences with ClickShare the amount of checks can vary.

2.1.1 Activating the Base Unit

Power state

It is recommended to verify the state of the Base Unit before starting to use ClickShare. This can help avoid basic issues and will guarantee a faster and more stable start of the meeting.

Depending on the configuration of the Base Unit, the current state of the device can be:

- · In sleep modus
- · On standby
- · Powered on
- Another state

The state can be easily defined through the information on the connected display or by checking the LED ring around the camera module of the Base Unit. For more information, see "The collaboration bar", page 8

Turn the Base Unit on

- 1. Is the Base Unit ready and powered on?
 - ▶ If yes, no further action required.
 - ▶ If no, continue with the next step.
- 2. Wake the Base Unit by pressing the standby button on the side. (reference 1)




Image 2-1 Example of locations to wake up the Base Unit

Note: If the Base Unit is not waking up, verify that the power has been plugged in. (reference 2)

To signal the device waking up the LED ring will start glowing.

3. If the device does not wake up, contact the local IT department.

2.1.2 Built-in camera

Overview

A camera is built into the Base Unit. To optimize the functionality and quality of the camera image ensure the following steps:

1. Remove the lens cover or any obstructions in front of the lens.




Image 2-2 Example of removal of the lens cap

- **P**
- Tip: Store the lens cover in a safe location!
- 2. Remove the protective film over the lens.
- 3. Clean the lens of any dust or fingerprints.

2.1.3 Pairing the Button(s)

About the Button

Button(s) must be paired with a Base Unit before they will work. An unpaired Button will not be able to share content nor connect to any display.



It is not possible to pair a Button with multiple Base Units!

Pairing a Button to a different Base Unit causes the Button to lose its connection with the originally linked Base Unit.

How to pair

- 1. Ensure the Base Unit is powered on.
- 2. Connect the Button to the "USB-C" port on the right side of the Base Unit.
 - Note: Only Buttons of generation 4.0 or higher are compatible with CB Core, CB Pro!




Image 2-3 Pairing location for the Button(s)

If a display is attached a notice "Busy pairing and updating" will appear at the bottom of the splash screen.

- Wait until the circle of the Button turns solid greenIf a display is attached a notice "Finished pairing and updating Button." will appear at the bottom of the screen.
- 4. Unplug the Button from the Base Unit.

The Button is now ready to be used!

2.2 ClickShare app

About the ClickShare app

To allow for more precise control while sharing, a ClickShare application can be installed and used on either a pc or mobile device.

2.2.1 Installing the desktop app

About the desktop app

Sharing through ClickShare does not necessarily require the desktop app to be installed, however the app does enable additional advanced features and allows for conferencing that will be missed out on without the app.



This manual will only refer to the new ClickShare app. For information or support about the old ClickShare, see previous versions.

Example of features improved or enabled by the desktop app:

- PresentSense.
- · Conferencing layouts.
- Simplified and enhanced forms of sharing.



Combine both the Button and the ClickShare app for maximum flexibility and capability.

How to install

- Chose and download the desired ClickShare desktop version.
 For more information about the differences between the version and to download the installer, visit <u>www.clickshare.app</u>.
- 2. Run and follow the instructions of the installer.




Image 2-4 Example of the advanced ClickShare desktop app after installation

The desktop app will open

3. Click on the blue button with the text "OK, got it" to start using the desktop app.

2.2.2 Installing the mobile app

About the mobile app

A mobile version of the ClickShare app is available to simplify sharing to ClickShare system with smartphones and tablets.



The mobile app uses the Wi-Fi capabilities of the device to allow for sharing. Connection to other Wi-Fi networks is not possible while the app is connected to a Base Unit!

Additional features available in the mobile app:

- Clicker support.
- · Screenshot / snapshot support.

How to install

- Download and install the mobile app.
 For more information on how to install the mobile app, visit www.clickshare.app.
- 2. Open the installed mobile app on the mobile device and approve the permissions.




Image 2–5 Example of the android ClickShare mobile app after installation

- **3.** Should a meeting be started now?
 - ▶ If yes, click on "Yes, I am in a ClickShare meeting room". For more information, see "Mobile app sharing", page 30.
 - ▶ If no, click on "No, show me the app first".




Image 2–6 Example of the home page of the android ClickShare app

2.2.3 App updates

About updates

The ClickShare app will automatically be kept up-to-date and download new versions in the background when available. When a new version has been downloaded the following notice will be shown:

About using ClickShare

How to effectively use and take advantage of advanced features will be explored in this chapter.

3.1 Connect to a meeting room

3.1.1 Methods of connecting

There are multiple methods to connect with a ClickShare system:

- Button
- ClickShare app
- Desktop app and Button (recommended)
- PresentSense

Depending on which method was chosen, internet access could be restricted.

3.1.2 Connecting with a Button

1. Connect a Button to a USB port of the device or with a dongle connected to the device.




Image 3-1 Example of where to connect a Button on a laptop

Note: A Button cannot be connected to a mobile device!

If the Button could not connect, see "Pairing the Button(s)", page 15.

2. Wait until the LED ring is fully lit up.

3.1.3 ClickShare app



Depending on the installation, external internet access can be lost while connecting with the desktop app alone. Connecting through the mobile app will always lose external internet access!




Image 3-2 Warning that network will be limited

- 1. Open the ClickShare app.
 - a) For mobile, connect to the Wi-Fi network of the ClickShare.




Image 3–3 Example of the connection not being correct

- Note: As this is a network is not connected to the internet, some devices may give warnings when connecting.
- Select the meeting room from the nearby meeting room options.If the room is not present in the list, use the search bar functionality:
 - · Press the refresh icon at the right side of the search bar
 - Type the meeting room name or IP address




Image 3–4 Example of a room selection on desktop

3. Enter the passcode shown on the display.





Image 3–5 Example of a room selection on mobile






Image 3–7 Example of the passcode entry screen mobile app

The sharing window will be displayed.

3.1.4 Button & desktop app

1. Connect a Button to a USB port of the device or with a dongle connected to the device.




Image 3-8 Example of where to connect a Button on a laptop

If the Button could not connect, see "Pairing the Button(s)", page 15.

- **2.** Wait until the LED ring is fully lit up.
 - The ClickShare app will open.
- 3. Enter the passcode shown on the display.




Image 3–9 Example of the passcode entry screen desktop app

Tip: Press "Try Again" or "Show Passcode Again" if the passcode was not displayed long enough.

The sharing window will be displayed.

3.1.5 PresentSense

- 1. Enable the PresentSense functionality in the app through one of the following three methods:
 - a) **Desktop app**: open the settings through the menu in the upper right corner and scroll to the bottom to enable PresentSense.




Image 3–10 Example of the desktop app settings location




Image 3-11 Example of an enabled PresentSense settings

b) **Mobile app** (homescreen): tap on the "Walk in and connect" text or icon and tap "Enable PresentSense".




Image 3-12 Example of enabling PresentSense on the homescreen on android

c) **Mobile app** (settings): swipe to the left or tap the menu icon in the upper right corner to open the settings and enable the PresentSense setting.





Image 3-13 Example of an enabled PresentSense settings on android

ClickShare will use the devices microphone to scan for nearby meeting rooms.



- 2. Walk in range of the meeting room.
 - All nearby meeting rooms will appear on the homepage.
- 3. Click on the desired meeting room to start sharing.

3.2 Configuring the peripherals

About the peripherals

When connecting to a CB Core, CB Pro all of its internal peripherals become available to use on the connected device. These can be selected as default output for the computer or selected in meeting apps for use in meetings with sharing or conferences.

The peripherals are named:

- ClickShare room speakerphone (microphone and speakers)
- ClickShare room camera (built-in camera)

If additional room peripherals are connected to the ClickShare, then ClickShare will manage and combine them with the internal peripherals. To use these additional peripherals, the same settings must be set as if there were no additional peripherals.

When the ClickShare peripherals are being used, their icon on the bottom left of the wallpaper will turn green.

3.2.1 Setting up the peripherals

How to configure

- 1. Set the sound settings on the connected computer to the following:
 - Sound output (speakers): ClickShare room speakerphone
 - Sound input (microphone): ClickShare room speakerphone
- 2. Configure the volume of the speakers:
 - ▶ Adjust the volume through the speaker settings of the connected computer.
 - ▶ Adjust the volume on the Base Unit (reference 1 and 2, Image 3–16).
 - ▶ Adjust or mute the volume through the ClickShare app (Image 3–17).
 - ▶ Adjust or mute the volume with the ClickShare virtual remote ("Virtual remote", page 26).




Image 3-16 Location of the volume buttons on the Base Unit

3. Verify the microphone sound by testing the microphone or mute the microphone.




Image 3–18 Example of muting the microphone in the ClickShare app

- 4. Set the camera setting on the connected device to ClickShare room camera.
- 5. Manage the camera:
 - ▶ Select the desired framing in the ClickShare app (Image 3–19).
 - ▶ Manage the camera with the ClickShare virtual remote ("Virtual remote", page 26).




Image 3-19 Example of how to change the camera framing

The peripherals have been setup successfully!

3.2.2 Virtual remote

About the virtual remote

The virtual remote allows any user connected to the CB Core, CB Pro to manage the camera and speakers from inside the ClickShare app.

Click on the remote icon in the ClickShare app to open the remote pop-up.



- Reset any modification to the camera position
- Zoom in (Original Camera View Point only)
 Zoom in halfway (Original Camera View Point only)
- Zoom out (Original Camera View Point only)
- Opens the ClickShare desktop app
- Volume down

- Mute / unmute speakers
- Volume up
- Camera position information (Original Camera View Point only)
- Tilt up (Original Camera View Point only)
- Pan right (Original Camera View Point only)
- Tilt down (Original Camera View Point only)
- Pan left (Original Camera View Point only)
- Reset pan and tilt (Original Camera View Point only)

3.3 Screen sharing

3.3.1 Methods of sharing

ClickShare enables the sharing of content on connected screen(s) from connected devices for participants in the room. While sharing the peripherals can be used to play stereo audio. If there are two displays connected to the Base Unit, it is possible to share from two separete devices at the same time.

Depending on the connection used, different options for sharing can be available.

- Sharing with a Button
- Sharing with the desktop app

- Sharing with the mobile app
- · Supported third party sharing applications

3.3.2 Button sharing



Sharing will be enhanced by combining the use of a Button with the ClickShare desktop app!

The Button allows for the mirroring (sharing) of all the content currently displayed on the connected device to the meeting room monitor(s) in real time.

Pressing the central share button of the connected Button will toggle the sharing of the main screen. If multiple devices are sharing at the same time, then the content will be resized and distributed across the meeting room monitor(s).

To stop all other screens from being shared and take over sharing on the meeting room monitor(s), press and holding the central share button.

3.3.3 Desktop app sharing



Sharing will be enhanced by combining the use of a Button with the ClickShare desktop app!

About desktop sharing

There are two ways of sharing content through the desktop app:

- · Sharing a window or application
- · Sharing a screen

Click on the thumbnail of desired screen or application to start sharing the selected content to the meeting room monitor(s) in real time. It is possible to switch between sharing different screens or applications at any time by clicking on another thumbnail.




Image 3-22 Example of the sharing window

Preview display(s)

If local view is enabled on the Base Unit an eye icon in the upper right corner will be present. Clicking the eye icon will pop-up a preview window. This window will show what is currently being displayed on the meeting room monitor(s).



Preview cannot be used while content is being shared, for security reasons.

How to share single screen

The currently shared window or application will get a red border and two advanced options as overlay:

- Stop sharing: disconnects the sharing functionality.
- Pause / resume sharing: will freeze / resume content that is being shared on the meeting room monitor (s).




Image 3-24 Example of window being shared




Image 3-25 Example of shared window being paused

If multiple devices are sharing at the same time, then the content will be resized and distributed across the meeting room monitor(s).

How to share dual screen

When sharing to two displays, two options will be available:

- · Side by side
- · Take over display

The first window or desktop being shared will be displayed on both displays. Clicking on another window or desktop will give the two options again and depending on the choice something different will happen:

- Clicking Take over display will show the window or desktop on both displays.
- Clicking Side by side will show the original on the primary display and the newly selected option on the secondary display.

Content that is being shared can:

- Take over both displays
- Stop per monitor
- Pause per monitor



To share another window or desktop, one of the shared content must be stopped or the new window or desktop must take over both screens.

3.3.4 Mobile app sharing

Start sharing

Casting or sharing the screen of the mobile device can be done by tapping the share button in the middle of the screen.




Image 3-28 Example of the share screen on android

While sharing the full currently active screen on the mobile phone will be shared in real-time. It is not possible to share specific screens nor applications, as what is seen on the mobile device, will be shown on the screen.




Image 3-29 Example of screen that is being shared on android

Additional features

There are three additional features available while sharing on a mobile device:

- Pause the sharing by tapping on the pause button in the bottom right corner, near the share button
- Control the screen or share with a clicker by tapping on the clicker icon at the bottom right corner, near the share button
- Take screenshots or preview of what is being displayed on the meeting room monitor(s) by taping on the screenshot icon in the upper right corner, near the share button



Image 3–30 Example of the pause icon on android




Image 3–31 Example of the pause icon on android

When taking a screenshot, a new window will be displayed. This window previews what will be screenshot. There are multiple options on what can be done with the taken screenshot:

- Share the screenshot over wireless connections.
- · Save the screenshot locally.
- Delete the screenshot when it is no longer needed.

3.3.5 Third party sharing

It is possible to combine the sharing functionality of certain third party apps with ClickShare.

The supported apps are:

AirPlay

- Google cast
- Miracast

To use any of these apps, make sure that the device is connected to the Wi-Fi network of the ClickShare and start sharing. For more information on how to use these apps, refer to their respective documentation.

3.4 Conferencing

3.4.1 Methods of conferencing

ClickShare supports multiple different ways of conferencing with remote and local participants. Any connected display (s) and additional peripheral (s) can be used while conferencing. The CB Core, CB Pro will play all audio in mono during confercing.

Conferencing methods supported possible are:

- Standard conferencing.
- · Hostflow.
- · One click join.

3.4.2 Standard conferencing

About standard conferencing

ClickShare will support and enhance the experience of joining remote meetings regardless of the meeting service used.

How to join a remote meeting

- 1. Accept the meeting invite on the remote conferencing app or website of choice.




Image 3-34 Example of the upcoming meeting on the home screen




Image 3–35 Example of the calendar integration while sharing




Image 3-36 Meeting details splashscreen




Image 3-37 Reminder within the ClickShare app to share screen in the meeting app




Image 3-38 Layout selection options

About blackboarding & annotations




Image 3-39 Example of icon to start annotations

Creating drawings

While in blackboarding or annotation mode, different icons to create or manage drawings will be enabled.




Image 3-40 Example of a screen in annotation mode




Image 3–42 Example of the right click menu in Microsoft Office PowerPoint




Image 3-43 Example of the desktop app settings location




Image 3-44 Example of calendar integration enabled with all e-mail account access




Image 3–45 Example of the calendar integration on the home screen $\,$




Image 3-46 Example of the calendar integration while sharing

About leaving

After the meeting has concluded or the use of the ClickShare is no longer immediately required, then this chapter will advice on some best practices to minimize the impact on the next person.

4.1 Closing the connection

About closing the connection

If the connection between the connected device(s) and ClickShare has been broken or ended abruptly, then the ClickShare system will default back to the wallpaper after some time has passed. No content will remain on screen for long periods of time, however it is still recommended to close the connection properly.

The proper methods to close the connection depend on the connection that was made and are:

- Closing with the Button
- · Closing with the ClickShare app

Button connection closing

- 1. Press the center share button to stop the sharing.
- 2. Ensure no more content is being shown on the display and the wallpaper has returned.
- 3. Disconnect the Button(s) from their connected device(s).

ClickShare app connection closing

1. Stop sharing content by pressing the stop icon on the left of the shared screen or window in the app.




Image 4-1 Example of stop button on a shared screen

2. Disconnect from ClickShare by pressing the disconnect button in the upper left corner.




Image 4-2 Disconnect button

4.2 Hardware cleanup

About hardware cleanup

The CB Core, CB Pro contains features that can be damaged or less preforming due to improper storage. Therefore it is recommended to protect and clean up the Base Unit when leaving.

Button cleanup

Store or return the used Button(s) back to their original location in the meeting room. This helps prevent Buttons being lost or damaged and speeds up the time it can take for the next person to start using ClickShare.

Lens protection

1. Clean any dust or finger prints from the lens.




Image 4-3 Attach direction for the lens cover



5.2 Front cover replacement




Image 5-2 Location of the five screws to unscrew




Image 5-3 Location of the two front cover screws to unscrew




Image 5-4 Pull direction for the side fixations




Image 5-5 Location of all fixations and direction to pull the front cover




Image 5-6 Left fixation points




Image 5-10 Location of the two front cover screws to tighten




Image 5-11 Location of the five screws to tigthen
